 - a) "...I had got on so fast of late, that I had even started a boy in boots top boots in bondage and slavery to whom I might be said to pass my days. For, after I had made this monster (out of refuse of my washerwoman's family) and had clothed him with a blue coat, canary waistcoat, white cravat, creamy breeches, and the boots already mentioned, I had a to find him a little to do and a great deal to eat...."
 - b) The whole family, in short were properly overjoyed on the occasion. The younger girls formed hopes of coming out a year or two sooner than they might otherwise have done; and the boys were relieved from their apprehension of Charlotte's dying an old maid. Charlotte herself was tolerably composed. She had gained her point, and had time to consider of it. Her reflections were in general satisfactory."
