- The lyrical quality of Hopkins' poetry gives his poems a distinctive style. Do you agree with this statement? Discuss with examples from three poems written by Gerard Manley
 Hopkins.
- 7) How does John Keats explore the themes of 'mortality' and 'impermanence' of life in at least two of his odes you have studied?
- 8) Eliot's *The Love Song of Alfred Prufrock* could also be read as a universal crisis faced by humanity living in social settings that are debased. Do you agree? Discuss with close reference to the text of the poem.
- 9) In Synge's play Riders to the Sea, is Maurya a tragic heroine or simply a victim of her circumstances? Discuss.
