- 2. What is the significance of the concept of deconstruction to understanding development? Explain the influence of Derrida and Foucault for critical theories of development.
- 3. What are the social obligations connected with communication for peace? Contextually discuss with reference to the work of Johann Galtung.
- 4. "Surveillance and control are characteristics that are rampant even in modern organizations". Critically discuss Foucault's explanation of power with reference to the Panopticon Model.
- 5. Modernization as a process is often undermined as a result of aspirations to defend feudal tendencies and social class incompatibilities. Discuss with reference to the work of Inkeles.
- 6. Discuss the salient features of Naila Kabeer's Social Relations Framework.
- 7. What are the salient aspects worthy of consideration in the context of Naila Kabeer's explanation of women?
- 8. The position of Amartya Sen that countries become fit for development through democracy is anothema to autocratic regimes masquerading as democracies. Discuss.
- 9. Laderach's contribution cannot be ignored in the context of post war trust building efforts. Discuss.
