- 3. What is kinship? Discuss using examples from different cultures.
- 4. Discuss the differences between Durkheim's explanation of religion and that of Geertz.
- 5. Recently, Sri Lankans experienced what was described as a 'constitutional crisis'. Discuss what we can learn about power and politics through this experience.
- 6. Explain how Marxist theory describes social change.
- 7. University students in Sri Lanka often engage in public protests for various reasons. Using a symoblic interactionist approach, how would you explain this behaviour?
- 8. "Women have achived equality therefore, feminism is outdated in today's world". Do you agree or disagree? Discuss.

- 9. "Sri Lankan women have greater autonomy and room for manouvering within social structures than other Asian women". Discuss in relation to the concepts of structure and agency.
- 10. Write short notes on four (4) of the following:
  - a. Foucault and the idea of discourse
  - b. Key features of functionalism
  - c. Relevance of Secularisation in today's society
  - d. Homo-economicus
  - e. Caste in modern society
