

5. Read the following passage and answer the questions given below.

Technological advances are seen in every sphere of activity today and telecommunication is no exception. Telecommunication facility is no longer considered a luxury. Much work can be executed from one's residence if the telecom facility is available. It also helps to maintain a clean environment. In today's context, the environment does not mean only the physical environment around us, it also includes the human or the social environment.

Concern on the environmental degradation was highlighted at the United Nations Conference held at Stockholm in 1970. The new concept of 'Sustainable Development' was introduced at this conference and it was once again emphasised at the United Nations Conference Environment and Development held at Rio de January in 1992.

For the development of any country, infrastructure has to be in place. Basic infrastructure facilities required for development are roads, electricity and telecommunication. Thus telecommunication has become a vital component in our daily lives. The developments in this field such as radio communication, cellular communication,

satellite communication, use of optical fiber and finally the proposed information super highway has brought distant global communities more and more together.

 Telecommunication interacts not only with the natural environment but also with both social and cultural environment. During the last decade telecommunication has advanced quite rapidly specially the mobile telephones with cellular communication facilities. A few years back the cellular mobile phone was identified with the affluent class but times have changed. In Sri Lanka, it has been found that one has to wait for a long period to obtain a conventional phone. Hence even an ordinary man who has lot of dealings with his fellow countrymen resort to acquiring at least a mobile phone to attend to business activities. Today in Sri Lanka there are several mobile telephone companies operating which provide different types of telephones to suit different users.

With the introduction of the cellular phone the use of cable wires has been reduced to a bare minimum thus enhancing the appearance of the natural environment. Telecommunication taken as a whole, not only provides a fast communication facility but also contributes to the mitigation of environmental degradation. People who are having telephone facilities reduce their vehicular travelling to a bare minimum thus helping to reduce the emission of harmful gases from vehicles such as carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, lead etc. **Congestion** of roads will also be reduced.

One should not ignore the possible environmental impact resulting from expanding the telecommunication facilities. One of the glaring impacts is the degradation of the scenic beauty of the physical environment especially in the hill country area where gigantic telecommunication towers are erected on hilltops. Degrading environmental impact resulting from the construction of these towers could be <u>minimised</u> if the cellular companies involved jointly erect the towers thus reducing the number of towers needed.

Laying of telecommunication cables and excavating for such activities could also cause environmental problems unless they are done in a systematic and a responsible manner. Unless properly installed, the overhead wires could affect the scenic beauty of the area. Special care should be taken when drawing overhead wires or erecting telecom towers in environmentally sensitive areas, such as forest reserves, wildlife reserves, migratory paths of birds etc. and also locating them close to archaeological reserves.

It is very necessary that precautions are taken to mitigate these environmental issues at the <u>initial</u> stages of the development activities. One should go a little further and see that these issues are considered at the planning stage itself. Well - integrated, and coordinated mechanism among various controlling agencies is a prerequisite to avoid unnecessary environmental damage that could be caused by rapid development of the telecommunication facilities.
