Part A

- 1) "In the language classroom the teacher can create opportunities for social interaction by using a number of activities and situations. Some of these accept the reality of the classroom situation itself. Others use simulation as a means of overcoming to some extent, at least, the limitations."
 - a) What are the limitations that the teachers are faced with in the language classroom?
 - b) What are the factors that the teacher must consider when selecting activities and situations for a specific group of students?
- 2) a) Compare and contrast the Audio Lingual Method and the Communicative Method.
 - b) According to your opinion, which method would be more effective in learning a language? Give reasons.
- 3) The meaning of Language Structure is not to be taught through explanation in mother tongue but is to be deduced from the way those are used in a situation. Discuss two methods which incorporate the above idea in teaching a language.

- 4) According to William Littlewood, the learner should be guided from dependence on the teacher and opportunities to use language in the classroom, to using language alone and in real authentic situations.
 - How could a teacher guide his / her pupils through this process in the second language classroom? Elaborate your answer providing examples.
