PART-A

- 1) Write short notes on each of the following terms. Your answer should explain the concepts and include examples from your own social network or community:
  - a) Situation
  - b) Situational shifts
- Define the term <u>Metaphorical Switching</u> and explain the conditions under which this Sociolinguistic phenomenon takes place.
- 3) "Wherever two or more <u>speech communities</u> maintain prolonged contact within a broad field of communication, there are <u>cross-currents of diffusion</u>." (Gumperz, 1968). Discuss.
- According to Gumperz (1968) "Language loyalty may become a political issue in a modernizing society when hitherto socially isolated minority groups become mobilized". Explain what "Language loyalty" is and discuss the above statement in relation to the language situation in Sri Lanka.
- 5) Explain the terms "the power semantic" and "the solidarity semantic" in relation to any two Sri Lankan languages that you are familiar with.
