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

4. Read through the following passage and answer the questions given below.

A firm doing business in two or more countries is referred to as a multinational enterprise (MNE). Such firms have sales offices and, in many cases, manufacturing facilities in <u>numerous</u> countries. <u>They</u> view their range of operations as global in nature. American firms such as Coca – Cola, Chrysler, Nike and IBM conduct a significant part of their business overseas. For example, Master Word Services, a Houston – based translation firm with fewer than twenty employees, also has offices in London, Baku and Moscow.

The decision to become an MNE is fully a major one. Although the choice includes consideration of many factors, the move to becoming a MNE essentially comprises three primary decisions: the international market to be served, the product or services to be marketed, and the mode of entry into the international market.

Selecting the country (or countries) as the site for <u>international</u> <u>expansion</u> involves considering many aspects of the country's environment. Many international businesses take into account the market size in the prospective host country (both current and potential size), the country's consumer wealth (per capta income) and the ease of doing business in the market. In assessing this latter criterion, organisations consider such factors as geographical location, common language, and the availability of employees with the skills which the business will require.

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	What products or services should an organization establish in an	
	international market? In answering this question, many firms follow the	
	shot – in – the – dark method; this means they select one or more of their	
	products (or services) that have done well in their domestic market and	
	introduce it into the chosen international market. Kellogg's Corn Flakes,	
	Coca - Cola and Mc Donald's hamburgers were introduced in this	
	manner.	
	A growing number of companies are using more analytical	
	approaches to product or service selection. Some firms travel to the	
	selected host country and conduct product - market research to	
	determine consumer needs. Then the company returns home with the	
	research and designs a product that fits the consumer needs. The new	
	product is then introduced into the host country. Ferrero's Tic Tac	
	breath minto and IDV's Bailey's Irish Cream Liqueur are products that	
	were specifically developed and marketed based on research of multiple	
	international markets.	
	Regardless of the approach taken by an organization, a successful	
	international product or service requires that primary attention be given	
	to the needs and preferences of the consumers in the host country.
