- 03. Explain in brief three procedures that could be adopted by the school to help adolescents to express their emotions in a socially accepted manner.
- 04. State three ways that the peer group can support adolescents in developing their self concept.
- 05. Indicate three reasons for the parent-youth conflicts among Sri Lankan families.
- 06. In Sri Lanka, a high suicide rate is reported among adolescents. Briefly explain two reasons leading to this situation.
- 07. Adolescents are risk takers. Explain in brief the role that a school counsellor could play in providing necessary advice to adolescents.
- 08. Explain the influence of media in moulding attitudes of adolescents in Sri Lanka.
