 - b) So you think that I am mad? A madman cannot plan. But you should have seen me.

 and loving.
 - c) Oh yes! Do let the portraits of your uncle and aunt Phillips be placed in the gallery at Pemberly. Put them next to your great uncle the judge. They are in the same profession you know: only in different lines.

d) "Imperceptibly I became conscious of a change in Biddy, however. Her shoes came up at the heel, her hair grew bright and neat, her hands were always clean. She was not beautiful—she was common, and could not be like Estella-'.
